1. INTRODUCTION

'Association Africaine pour la Fixation Biologique de l'Azote (AABNF) est une organisation scientifique, apolitique et non gouvernementale. La constitution de l'AABNF est indiquée à l'annexe 1.

L'AABNF a tenu sa prernière conférence à Nairobi (Kenya) du 23 au 27 Juillet 1984. La deuxième conférence qui s'est tenue au Caire du 15 au 19 Novembre 1986 avait pour but essentiel, mis à part les comptes rendus sur les nouvelles acquisitions sur la Fixation Biologique de l'azote (FBA) en Afrique, de statuer sur la constitution de l'association et d'élire un nouveau bureau.

2. PARTICIPATION DU MIRCEN DE L'AFRIQUE DE L'OUEST

Une active correspondance a été initiée entre le département ISRA de recherches sur les productions végétales, l'UNESCO (Dr. E. J. DaSILVA) et le MIRCEN du Caire (Dr. M.N.I. MAGDOUB) pour assurer la participation de tous les correspondants du MIRCEN de l'Afrique de l'ouest. Nous devrions représenter le Sénégal avec Ousmane Diagne (ISRA-CNRF) et Ibrahima NDOYE (ORSTOM). Malgré les dispositions prises par Dr. MAGDOUB et son équipe, nous étions seuls (Mamadou GUEYE) à participer à cette conférence. Pour cela, nous avions été obligés de transformer notre titre de transport (reçu trés tard) Dakar-Abidjan-Caire-Abidjan-Dakar en un titre de transport Dakar-Paris-Caire. Dr. MAGDOUB, trbs compréhensif, nous a délivré un autre titre de transport Caire-Paris-Dakar à notre arrivée au Caire.

Il est probable que les correspondants du MIRCEN de l'Afrique de l'Ouest qui étaient attendus au Caire aient reçu trop tard leur titre de transport et que par conséquent, ils n'ont pas pu participer à la deuxième conférence AABNF.

3. CONFERENCE AABNF

La conférence comprenait 11 sessions:

Aspects génétiques et compétitivité des Rhizobium

- Facteurs écologiques affectant la FBA par les Rhizobium
- Facteurs écologiques affectant la FBA par les fixateurs non symbiotiques.
- Algues bleues fixatrices d'azote.
- Effets synergiques des microorganismes sur la FBA.
- Economie d'azote et systèmes de cultures associées.
- Recherche et application de la FBA en Afrique.
- Production d'inoculum et application.
- Inoculatyion des céréales avec les fixateurs non symbiotiques.
- Table ronde sur les MIRCENS.
- Table ronde sur les Organisations du système des Nations Unies et leur implication dans l'application de la FBA.

4. CONSTITUTION DE L'AABNF

Durant la conférence, la constitution de l'AABNF (annexe 1) a été lue, amendée et approuvée à l'unamité.

5. BUREAU DE L'AABNF

Les articles VI et VII de la constitution de l'AABNF prévoient 12 membres dans le comité exécutif: un président, un vice-président, un trésorier et 9 membres permanents représentant les 5 régions de l'Afrique, les 3 MIRCENS et l'IITA (Ibadan) qui a été un des organismes fondateurs de l'AABNF. Il faut remarquer que le trésorier est toujours choisi danbs le pays où réside le président élu de l'association.

6. CONTACTS

Le seul contact que nous avions eu a été Dr. BORDELEAU L.M. Ensemble, nous avons revu et corrigé la publication commune que nous voudrions soumettre à Mircen Journal of Applied Microbiology and Biotechnology au plus tard le _{1er} Fevrier ₁₉₈₇. Cette publication traitera des travaux que nous avons conduits sur le Voandzou dans le cadre de notre Projet NAS.

76. TROISIEME CONFERENCE DE L'AABNF

La troisième conférence de l'AABNF sera organisée par le MIRCEN de l'Afrique de l'Ouest du 7 au 12 Novembre 1988 à Dakar.

Le thème de la conférence sera: MAXIMIZING BIOLOGICAL NITROGEN FIXATION FOR

AGRICULTURAL AND FORESTRY PRODUCTION IN AFRICA.

Un comité local d'organisation devra nécessairement être constitué au plus tard le 15 Février 1987. Nous rappelons que Pr. DOMMERGUES a déja accepté de parrainer cette troisième conférence AABNF. Egalement, Dr. BORDELEAU se propose de faire parti du comité international d'organisation.

AFRICAN ASSOCIATION FOR BIOLOGICAL NITROGEN FIXATION

(Preliminary Draft)

PREAMBLE

We the Biological Nitrogen Fixation (BNF) Scientists delegated from different research, education and executive institutions in Africa, conscious of the serious food situation in Africa and the vital need to increase bioproductivity, which call for every effort and effective inter-country cooperation in all aspects pertaining to increasing production of food and bioenergy and compalicity The rapid rise in the price of chemical desentification. fertilizers and the related constraints of foreign currency as well as the low officient infna-structures needed for transport and distribution has sorsened the situation and thus calls for increased use of bio-fertilizers to improve both yields and quality and avoid environmental polution. Aware of the extensive rsearch activities in some African countries in the areas of BNF and the individual experimentation in some other African countries. and of the need for additional effort to collate and interprete the existing information from the major ecological zones and subsequently to propose economically viable systems of improving land productivity to Member countries in Africa for adaptation to their specific needs.

The desire for the African Association for Biologic Nitrogen Fixation was expressed at various meetings helin Ithaca, New York; Ibadan, Nigeria; Dakar, Senegal; and Cairo, Egypt. These meetings paved the way for the First Conference of the African Association for Biological Nitrogen Fixation (Nairobi, 23-27 July, 1984). Have resolved to unite themselves in the pursuit of their common aims and objectives and hereby to establish an African Association for Biological Nitrogen Fixation (AABNF) Scientific and Technical Cooperation in harmony with the spirit of the Organization of African Unity (OAU), The Association of Faculties of Agriculture in Africa (AFAA) and similar African Organizations.

CONSTITUTION

ARTICLE I: NAHE

The **name** of this Organisation shall be 'Africa Association for Biological **Nitrogen** Fixation (AABNF)' hereinafter to be referred to as the Association.

ARTICLE II: AFFILIATION

The Association shall be affiliated to other symplar organizations as might further its objectives.

ARTICLE III: OBJECTIVES

The African Association for Biological Nitrogen Fixation
"AABNF" is a non-polical, non-profit making, scientific

Qrganization that deals with biological **nitrogen** fixation systems. The **purpose** of establishing this association is to **promote** research and application of BNF in **all** regions of African continent.

The main objectives of the AABNF are as follows:

- 3.1. To stand on the recent developments in the field of BNF in African Institutions and identify scientists working in the subject.
- 3.2. Identification of societies working in the field of BNF in different regions of Africa.
- 3.1. Promotion of BNF research and applications Carried

 out by African institutions and initiation of such

 activities in other countries.
- 3'4. Initiation and/or supporting organized meetings, symposia and training courses dealing with BNF in the different regions of Africa.
- 3.5. Encouraging publication of scientific papers, technical reports and extension materials dealing with research and application in the field of BNF in Africa.
- 3.6. Establishment of documentation centers in the different rent regions of Africa to organize information about research activities, genetic materials and available technical information and services in the fields of BNF.

- 3.7. Preparation of a bibliography of institutions and scientists working in the field of BNF in Africa periodecally.
- 3.8. Promotion of network type cooperation on regional is lal... basis between institutions working on same fields of BNF.
- 3.9. Organizing a General beiannual Conference on BNF to present recent revelopment in the field of BNF

ARTICLE IV: MEHBERSHIP

1. There shall be three types of membership:

The tollowing categories of memberships:

- (i) Full Members;
 (ii) Affiliated Members;
 (iii) Tudent
 (iv) Honorary Members.
- 2. (i) Full membership shall be open to all persons, institutions working on the BNF research on application of Universities entitled to be members of the Association of African Universities (A.A.U.) and all other Institutions of Higher Agricultural Education in Africa, provided Such dues are paid as may be deternined by the Association from time ta time;
 - Arsociated membership shall be open to any pet-son interested in the area of BNF, furthering the objectives of the Association, subject to the approval of Executive Committee;

 ∞

- Organization, Society, Association or any other similar body promoting the interests of Biofertilizers and/or agricultural development in Africa, on the recommendation of the Executive Committee and subject to the consent of the biennial General Meeting;
- (iv) Only Full Members shall have the right to vote at meetings of the Association.
- 4. Any member may be expelled from the Assocation if the Executive Committee so recommends and if a General Meeting resolves by a two-thirds majority of the Full Member present at the general meeting that Such a member should be expelled on the grounds that its conduct has adversely affected the reputation or dignity of the Association, or that it has contravened any of the provisions of the Constitution. The Executive Committee shall have the power to suspend a member form his/her membership until the next General Meeting of the Association following Such suspension, but this notwithstanding a member whose expulsion is proposed shall have the right to address the General Meeting at which its expulsion is to be considered;

- 5. Membership shall be suspended automatically in the event of failure to settle the annual subscription for two consecutive years. All membership rights will automatically be regained on payment of the total amount of subscription outstanding;
- 6. Any member who resigns or is removed from membership shall not be entitled to a refund of his/her membership ship fee or subscription or any part thereof or any moneys contributed at any time.

ARTI CLE Y: RESOI JRCES

The resources of the Association shall consist of:

- Membership fees applicable to both Full and Associate
 Member which shall be two US dollars or its
 equivalent in convertible currency;
- 2. Grants, gifts, donations, bequests, legacies. etc.. from individuals, governments, national parastatal and private organisations, regional and international organizations.

ARTICLE VI: EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

1. There shall be an Executive Committee of the Association, made up of three Officers and nine Officers members.

Each of these shall be elected from the Full Members at the biennial General Meeting. They shall hold office until the next biennial General Meeting.

- 2. No minations for offices in the Executive Committee of the Association should be made Seconded at the session of the biennial General Meeting that has been set aside for the purpose of the election of officers.

 In case of no representation of One or more of the five regions, candidates from this region can be recommended in absentiation provided that the nominees willingness to serve can be substanciated.
- 3. Voting of the élection of the officers and members of the Executive Committee of the Association shall be by secret ballot.
- 4. Any vacancies in the Executive Committee caused by resignation or any other cause will be filled by the Executive committee from among the runners-up in the previous election.
 - is delayed the **current** executive committee shall continue in office until **such** time as a general meeting is **convened**. The maximum period between general meetings however, shall not exceed 3 **years**.

ARTICLE VII: OFFICERS

- There shall be a Chairman, a Vice Chairman.
- 2. Secretary/Tresurer shall be co-opted by the Executive Committee for the country in which the Chairman is resident.

ARTICLE VIII DUTIES OF OFFICERS

- The Chairman shall normally preside at all General meetings of the Association and the Executive Committee Meetings; He shall be the spokesman for the Association in all matters of policy approved by the Association or the Executive Committee; and he shall represent the Association in all legal matters.
- 2. The Vice-Chairman shall perform all duties of the Chairman in the absence of the latter, and perform such other duties as May be assigned to him by the Chairman.
- 3. The Secretary/Tresurer shall be responsible for the records, finances and assets of the Association.

 He shall preppre audited accounts to the Executive Comnittee.

ARTI CLE IX: DUTI ES OF THE EXECUTI VE COMMITTEE

- 1. The Executive Committee shall manage the affairs and administer the funds of the Association in accordance with this Constitution and the policies and directives issued by the General meetings of the Association, and it shall prepare the budget of the Association for the consideration and approval of the biennial General Meeting;
- 2. The Executive Committee shall fulfil the objectives of the Association, among other things, by organizing s'cientific meetings, training course, study <code>groups</code>, and <code>any</code> other appropriate activities.
- 3. The Executive Committee shall collect, collate and disseminate information pertaining to the activities of the Association and prepare the minutes of the biennial and all other General Meetings and those of the Executive Copmittee and arrange for the publication, distribution and preservation of the reports and proceedings of all Meetings and Conferences of the Association.
- 4. The Executive Committee may establish rules under this constitution to facilitate the execution of its functions.

ARTICLE X: MEETINGS OF THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

The Executive Committee shall meet if possible once between every two consecituve biennial General Meetings; the Executive Committee meetings shall be called by the Chairman.

ARTICLE XI: GENERAL MEETINGS

- There shall be regular biennial General Meetings of the Association at a place to be decided upon at the previous General Meeting. The dates for these meeting: shall be determined by the Executive Committee and communicated to all Members at least six months in advance. The agenda for the biennial General Meetings shall be prepared by the Executive Committee in accordance with the apparent wishes of the Association and the provisions of this Constitution and in consultation with the members, and shall be despatched to all members and to Such observers as the Executive Committee shall decide to invite not less than six days before the scheduled date of the second states.
- The biennial General Meeting shall appoint Auditors
 who shall audit all accounts of the Association and
 submit a report the next biennial General Meeting;
- Be called by the Chairman at the request of two-thirds of the Full members, Such meetings shall require a minimum notice of sixty days and the agenda shall consist excluçively of those items listed in the request for such a meeting

- 4. Full members of the Association attending the meeting shall be entitled to vote.
- 5. All decisions at any General Meeting shall be taken by simple majority vote, except for those decisions relating to expulsion of mem rs and amendments to the Constitution which shall be subject to the provisions of Article IV (4) and XIV (2), respectively, and those relating to dissolution of the Association which shall be subject to the provisions of Article XV (1). In the case of equality of votes, the Chairman shall have a casting vote.

ARTICLE XII: QUORUM

- 1. The quorum at the biennial General Meetings and any other General Meetings shall be twenty five percent of the membership;
- 2. The quorum at the Executive Committee meetings shall be four elected members.

ARTICLE XIII; BYLAWS

The bylaws of the Association shall be prepared by the Executive Committee and approved by a General Meeting of the Association; amendments to bylaws may be made by simple majority vote at any General Meeting of the Association

ARTICLE XIV: AMENDMEN TS TO THE CONSTITUTION

- Amendments to the Constitution of the Association shall be considered only at a biennial General Meeting of the Association; proposals for Such amendments shall be made in writing, duly seconded, and circulated to all Full Members, at least sixty days before the date of the General Meeting at which the amendments are to be voted on:
- 2. Amendments to the Constitution shall be by a twothirds majority vote taken at the biennial General
 Meeting.

ARTICLE XV: DISSOLUTION

- 1. The Association shall not be dissolved except by a resolution passed at General Meeting by a vote of two-thirds of all Full Members of the Association.

 Full Members unable to attend the meeting shall be entitled to a postal vote.
- 2. Should the motion for dissolution be passed, the Secretary and Treasurer shall pay all debts and liabilities of the Association within one month and shall, within one further month, distribute the balance of the assets of the Association to the paid-up Full Member Institutions, in equal shares. No expenses, debts or liabilities shall

be incurred after the General Meeting at which the motion for dissolution of the Association was passed, except for the expenses directly connected with the settling of existing debts and liabilities and the distribution of the assets, and the Auditor's honorarium. The Auditor shall inspect the accounts and certify in writing to all Full Members that they are correct, duly vouched and in accordance with the law, or report in what respect they are found to be incorrect, unvouched or not in accordance with the law. The dissolution of the Association shall not take effect until the Auditor has certified that the accounts are correct in all respects and that no debts or assets remain.

ARTICLE XVI: TEXT LANGUAGE

The Arabic, English, French and Portugese certified versions of this Constitution shall be equally authoritative.
